Rules and Regulations

1. All fowl, including waterfowl, exhibited must be tested and rated Pullorum Typhoid Clean. **PLEASE ATTACH A COPY OF YOUR TEST CARD TO YOUR ENTRY.** Any bird showing signs of disease or vermin shall be removed from the show.
2. Classes: Cock, Hen, Cockerel, and Pullet in poultry, Waterfowl and Pigeons shall be Old Male, Old Female, Young Female, Young Male.
3. All Pigeons must be banded with seamless bands; unbanded birds may be banded and shown with split bands but must be shown in adult classes.
4. Birds may be handled by Exhibitor, Judge, Steward, or show officials only.
5. Bantams and Bantam Ducks will be judged by A.B.A. Standard. Large Fowl and all other Waterfowl shall be judged by the A.P.A. Standard of Perfection.
6. Protest: Must be filed with the Show Secretary within 30 minutes of judging of breed, along with a \$25.00 fee to be returned if the protest is upheld.
7. No exhibitors in the aisles while judging is taking place.
8. Coop in by 9:00 AM Sunday morning. Judging starts at 9:30 AM.
9. Birds may be cooped in between 2 and 6 PM on the Saturday before the show.
(Please call if other arrangements are needed.)
10. Exhibitors, please remove coop tags, feed and water cups after the show.
11. Members, please stay and help clean up after the show.
12. Although all possible care will be taken to protect your entries at the show, CMBF is

not responsible for any loss or damage to your birds. The ultimate care of entries is the responsibility of the exhibitor. Please provide your birds with water.

13. Judges shall be licensed and base their decisions using the American Poultry Association and the American Bantam Association Standards of Perfection.

Junior Show Rules

- 14. Juniors must handle and coop in their own birds.**

15. Junior entries are subject to all of the open show rules and regulations.

- 16. Junior entry fee is \$3.00 per bird. Double coop is \$6.00.**

17. Juniors must be present at time of judging of their entries.

1. All sale birds must be from tested, Pullorum Typhoid clean flocks.
2. Sale birds should be free of pests (lice and fowl mites).
3. Sale birds should be in good health.
4. Chicks cannot be sold singly, per state law.
5. Please do not overcrowd your sale coops or expose young birds to an unhealthy temperature.
6. Please provide your birds with water.
7. *Central Maine Bird Fanciers may not be held responsible for any poultry sales at the show.*

AVIAN INFLUENZA

One of our goals is for you to have a safe and good experience at our show and to have positive memories of the day when you return home. This being said, we are very aware of the problems the Avian Influenza has caused in the past. We are constantly checking with the state vets who monitor the situation in Maine. We ask that each exhibitor help us. Please be aware of what is happening in your area or state regarding the Avian Influenza. We ask you not to bring birds that are sick or may have been exposed to AI. **The Central Maine Bird Fanciers retains the right to refuse the entry of any bird into the show or onto the fairgrounds that is coming from a region that is a hot area of Avian Influenza.** If you are bringing birds for sale, please check these birds as well. You need to realize that the tailgate sales are on the grounds of the fairgrounds, and it

would be wise to leave some space between each seller. Selling birds at the show is only open to exhibitors and club members. There is a fee for exhibitors to sell birds, which is waived for club members. Thanks for helping us and let's hope this, too, shall pass with patience, care, and time.

ATTENTION WATERFOWL EXHIBITORS: Due to state recommendations, waterfowl should be housed in a separate building. This already occurs at our show. Please remember, however, that the building for waterfowl is not secured for overnight cooping.

DIRECTIONS TO THE SHOW

From Augusta:

Take Route 17 EAST for about 12 miles to Route 32 NORTH. Turn left onto Route 32 NORTH. Windsor Fairgrounds is on the left about 1/2 mile. The Poultry Building is located by the North Gate of the Windsor Fairgrounds next to the museum barn and windmill.

From the Coast:

Take Route 17 WEST toward Augusta (estimated 40+ or - miles from Rockland) Right onto Route 32 NORTH. Windsor Fairgrounds is on the left about 1/2 mile. The Poultry Building is located by the North Gate of the Windsor Fairgrounds next to the museum barn and windmill.
